THE AMES FOUNDATION ANNUAL REPORT



We continued to focus on building awareness and educating the community about The Ames Foundation and our vision and mission.

Throughout 2023, our board members were active in the community and represented The Ames Foundation at several events. The report will demonstrate the highlights of our work over the past year.

Vision: Advancing our community to showcase the generosity and spirit in Ames for a better tomorrow.

Mission: Engaging with partners, we connect generosity with opportunity, to serve as a catalyst for public projects that enhance the quality of life for Ames residents.

CREATING AWARENESS OF THE AMES FOUNDATION

As a board, we prioritized our attendance at local events to help spread awareness, create community, and seek volunteers for our various projects.

Music Walk - April 28, 2023











This event included rock painting for adults and children. Rocks could be taken home or placed in a park to make Ames even more beautiful. In addition to rock painting and live music, we also shared free tree saplings (25) to attendees with instructions on planting and care. This was a new initiative that aligned well with one of our main projects - tree plantings!

We also increased our fundraising efforts by selling candles and specially created cards made by one of our board members, Sammie Lyle. A sign up was available for interested volunteers for tree plantings.

Art Walk - June 1, 2023





Although the weather was cold and rainy, we still made our presence at the Main Street Art Walk to share more tree saplings (125), sell candles, cards, and tell attendees about our organization.

AMES COMMUNITY TREE PROGRAM

Aligned with our strategic plan, we continued our tree plantings to meet our goal of planning 2030 trees by the year 2030. In 2023, we worked with the City of Ames, Chevron Renewable Energy Group, Ames Town and Country Kiwanis, and Edwards Elementary on several tree planting events and planted 75 + 18 + 40 + trees in the following neighborhoods: Toronto Street, Ontario Cemetery, Sunset Ridge Park, River Valley Park, Edwards Elementary.

Our City of Ames Community Spring Tree Planting event occurred in the Toronto Street neighborhood on May 20, 2023. More than 40 volunteers enjoyed very nice planting weather and planted 75 trees. The Ames Foundation, on May 19, 2023, also facilitated tree planting with Chevron Renewable Energy Group and the Ames Town and Country Kiwanis along with their Ames High School Key Club. Altogether, these three groups provided 38 volunteers and planted 18 trees in River Valley Park.









Our City of Ames Community Fall Tree Planting event occurred in the Ontario Cemetery and Sunset Ridge Park. Twenty-three volunteers gathered on October 14, 2023 to plant 39 trees. The week prior on October 6, 2023, The Ames Foundation planted 11 trees with 7 volunteers from Renewable Energy Group. The trees were planted at Edwards Elementary School.









CITY OF AMES PARTNERSHIP AND GRANT OPPORTUNITY

In late 2023, we learned some exciting news that will likely make a great impact on our tree planting and tree planting goals. The City of Ames is working to finalize the details of a grant totaling \$810,000 from the United States Forest Service. The grant will double the number of trees planted by the City of Ames in right of way for the next five years as well as enable the City of Ames to establish a nursery for bare root trees to be cultivated for planting within the Ames and surrounding towns. The grant is transformational in enabling the City of Ames to reach its goal of replacing all ash trees on public land by 2032. The Ames Foundation will maintain support of the Community Tree Planting events through advertising, raising awareness, and organizing volunteers. Other opportunities to support planting trees at businesses, residences, and schools will be explored by The Ames Foundation.

FUNDRAISING

Our fundraising efforts included the selling of candles, cards, t-shirts at our annual event. Total funds raised with candles, cards and t-shirts was: \$300.

We also participated in the Ames Rummage Rampage event and were able to raise \$434.41 for our volunteer efforts.

ANNUAL APPEAL LETTER

Each year in November, we send an appeal letter to our list of donors. In 2023, we sent 1,010 letters. At the time of this report, we are happy to share we received over \$5000 in gift giving from our generous donors.



PARTNERS

We continued our partnership with Oak Lane Candle Co. to sell a custom scented candle with The Ames Foundation logo. We sold 11 candles at various events throughout the year. Any remaining candles will be utilized for additional opportunities in 2024.

NEW this year was custom made cards by our very own board member, Sammie Lyle. We are lucky to have her expertise and creativity when selling these cards toward our fundraising efforts.

NEW this year was a partnership with RayGun. We were able to collaborate with RayGun to create specialty TAF shirts. We purchased 100 shirts at a price of \$10.25 each. We then sold the shirts for \$20 each. Shirts are available for purchase at The Ames Chamber of Commerce, RayGun, and our events. We are thankful to RayGun for waiving the cost of the setup fee.



These are great shirts that our board members, volunteers, and community members can be seen proudly wearing and representing our organization. Additional shirts in our stock will be utilized in 2024.

THE AMES FOUNDATION CONTRIBUTOR OF THE YEAR

For 2023, our board nominated Jeff Iles. Jeff has served 2 terms on TAF board, he attends and trains new volunteers at the fall and spring tree plantings. Well over 1000 volunteers have been trained since 2015. He was instrumental in making TAF an affiliate of the Chamber, and he sponsors and attends our Annual

ANNUAL EVENT


